



Sheryl's story continues:

"It's amazing to me that a few layers of wool, soapy water, some rubbing and rolling makes a fabric that can be used in many ways. Felt can be used for a practical purpose or for a fanciful item; it can be flat or three dimensional, it can be plain or the colours of the rainbow, it can be used like paint and sculpted and shaped.

I studied fashion and have worked in the industry everywhere from the factory floor to teaching. I use the skills I have learnt over the years in my felting. I can create a piece of felt that can be cut and stitched into a garment, it can be dyed, printed, beaded, embroidered. Felt can be fine like cobwebs or as durable as a yurt, but as with any creative work is only limited by the makers imagination.

Finally I would like to take a moment to thank Sue Jurd for all her help and encouragement over the years and the beautiful dyed silk and wool. I doubt that I would have had the confidence to join an organization like Borderline or show my work. So thanks Miss Sue for your mentoring.

If anyone would like to know any thing else just ask. I'm always happy to share.
