
Congratulations Corner – Achievements of Borderline members

Theo Gard, newly elected Borderline Vice President, gave an informative "show and tell" after the AGM. Theo, a son of English/ Cretan parents, educated in Jamaica and Somerset, UK, studied Fine Art/ Printed Textile Design at the Somerset College of Art, Taunton, UK. graduating with a Diploma in Design and as a Licentiate of the Society of Industrial Artists & Designers.

Over the ensuing years Theo has been an Art Teacher with emotionally disturbed youth in UK, as well as juvenile offenders and those in distress in Brisbane. He has conducted Creative Communication – Healing Souls workshops for various Government/NGO organisations using art, drama, poetry, mime, music.

Laterally, Theo has worked as a Case Manager with elderly people, assessing their needs in their homes.

So, now retired, Theo has moved to Tenterfield & is getting back into the art stuff that he has always decided to do!

Theo brought along to the meeting a selection of art designs for textile production that he developed while in the UK. These included base drawings, full colour templates with different colour combinations, layouts for home furniture and room design. He spoke about the process of design, development and printing techniques that went into textile design and manufacture for clothing, home furnishings and material.

Theo, with a "sixties" jacket he designed and produced as part of his training in Fine Arts in the UK.
